

OVERTURN APPEARS LIKELY



The first thing to understand about the leaked draft is just how leaky it is. Our analysis shows that it is very, very leaky, much leakier than one would think at first glance. The second thing to bear in mind is how little draft there is. Really not much draft at all. The draft is really quite shallow. In most cases, leaks tend to increase draft, but not always. If draft is insufficient and stays are removed, the 49-year-old opinion might soon be overturned, especially if the summer turns choppy. Upending a precedent like this is hazardous; some states have grounds to tackle a reversal and others don't. If grounds are present, opponents of the Mississippi law may be able to wade. Otherwise, they'll have to row. The draft shows the justices have been canvassed, and perhaps over-canvassed. Five of them are leaning one way, three the other way. As for the man at the helm, nobody knows: Chief Justice Roberts sometimes tacks left when his more conservative colleagues tack right. Who leaked the leak? Does this scuttle it? We may never know the hull truth. The draft makes it clear, if the court was even sheltered from political winds, it isn't any longer. Many predict a hurricane in November, especially if the leak gets worse and the justices decline to bail.

MINUTES: Commodore Drew called the meeting to order at 7: 06 p.m. A motion was made and unanimously passed to accept the minutes of the April 2022 meeting minutes as published. The May meeting minutes are pending.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Launch: The two 2-stroke engines are operating. The new motor is at the club. They started to break it in. 4 stroke carb was removed and is now being rebuilt. Nick would like to use that engine on the new launch. There are 2 attendants hired with recruitment active at the sound school. Schedule hours are fewer while school is in session due to lack of staff. Hopefully, that will change, and we will have more staff after school is over. Launch service starts on the 15th.

Moorings have all been placed. Carlo inquired about different types of mooring balls. Chain through style is sold at Sea Spike. We are currently using threaded rod that is galvanized. It is better for boat without the rod. We discussed quick link to connect mooring ball to the chain versus shackle-through-the-chain link. Upon research there are different ways to assemble the mornings. The plan in the future is to use the shackle-to-the-chain method. Moorings were not set when they were dropped so they need to be set. Moorings should all be pulled toward the west. Boats will generally set the mushroom once on the mooring. The plan to set the mooring on Saturday.

COP allows us to have 55 moorings.

Yards and Docks: chain needs to be attached to the pilings.

Website: regularly updated by Paul.

House and Grounds: Gable end of the house needs to be painted. Trim on attic window has been removed. Leak is not at the flashing. Condition of the porch ceiling probably not from recent leaking. Dumpster was reported to have been emptied Monday. Area around the dumpster has also been filled and will likely collapse when the dumpster is removed making it difficult to re-install the dumpster. Paula is likely going to assume cleaning for the club. Need to do a major clean up before that though. Roofing nails need to be caulked on the porch.

Social: Memorial Day celebration will be on Monday May 30th at 4:00. We plan to have the awards banquet on that day as well. If you have a trophy, please bring it to the club so it will be available for the new recipient. I will send a list of the trophies out to the general membership. If members have recommendations on how to distribute the awards, then they can let me know.

NHYC sign has been installed on the clubhouse. It had been suggested that the front peak of the clubhouse needs to be painted and that the attic window repaired prior to re-install of sign, but it was decided that wasn't necessary at the last work party.

Lockers in the shed need to be paid for annually if you store items in the shed.

Rich requested to use club house on Wednesday, May 18 to host 40 people from his work. Discussed time to be afternoon evening 5-8. It was agreed that he can utilize the club for this event.

Raimund suggested we install a camera facing onto the mooring field. Our current Telecom system band width will not support this. It needs to be upgraded. Raimund and Paul to investigate service options.

Joe knows of a metal collector who will come down to the club should we need metal removal. Old chain

helps to shore up the riprap.

From the Society Page:



- The crew was never found.


